**Ementa:** Aprofundamento do estudo das estruturas complexas da língua inglesa em seus aspectos morfológicos, sintáticos, semânticos, lexicais, fonológicos e pragmáticos, desenvolvendo habilidades compreensão e expressão oral e escrita.

### Objetivos:

- i. Desenvolver capacidades comunicativas de nível avançado em língua inglesa, integrando o estudo das quatro habilidades, reading, writing, listening, speaking;
- ii. Aprimorar o conhecimento léxico-gramático da língua inglesa;
- iii. Refletir sobre o processo de aprendizagem e de avaliação no ensino de inglês como língua estrangeira;
- iv. Desenvolver a autonomia do aluno em seu processo de aprendizagem e como pesquisador de temas referentes ao ensino de inglês como língua estrangeira.

### Metodologia:

Os conteúdos serão apresentados através de aulas expositivo-dialogadas.

A base metodológica do curso é comunicativa, visando a uma prática capaz de integrar as capacidades comunicativas do aluno de língua inglesa, bem como suas habilidades e conhecimentos léxico-gramaticais, de modo a propiciar um aprendizado de caráter social e autônomo.

### Avaliação:

Para efeito de nota e Média Final serão efetuadas 3 avaliações a serem realizadas ao longo do semestre.

A Média Final será calculada com base na média aritmética das 3 avaliações. Também será levado em conta assiduidade, participação em sala de aula e realização dos exercícios do Workbook.

#### Speaking

- Unit 1: Listening to a news interview about a smoking ban; understanding and noting main points in a radio programme; identifying speakers' point of view;
- Unit 2: Taking notes from a lecture; understanding speaker attitudes and explicit and implicit information;
- Unit 3: Following extended speech using colloquialisms and idiomatic expressions; understanding speakers' opinions;
- Unit 4: Following a lecture on body shapes; understanding idiomatic expressions in colloquial speech and speakers' intentions
- Unit 5: Understanding implicit information in colloquial speech; taking notes from an interview and from a meeting.

**Writing:**

- Unit 1: Writing a letter to a newspaper;
- Unit 2: Producing an interview guide for a web page;
- Unit 3: Writing an advice leaflet;
- Unit 4: Writing a letter about a personal problem;
- Unit 5: Presenting arguments and counter-arguments in a discursive essay.

**Reading:**

- Unit 1: Reading texts about changing attitudes and legal bans; identifying specific information in texts;
- Unit 2: Understanding technical descriptions; taking notes from a text;
- Unit 3: Understanding complex news reports; understanding a TV guide and a contemporary poem;
- Unit 4: Extracting information from a professional text; summarizing information in a text; relating text information to specific situations;
- Unit 5: Reading website descriptions of clubs; predicting text content; reading and note-taking; reading for implicit information.

**Lexico-Grammar (Vocabulary and Language Focus):**

- Unit 1: Continuous and perfect verb forms; meanings of *lift*; spoken stance markers
- Unit 2: Cohesive devices; collocations with take; different uses of *will* for future; communication
